Was Marco's Mama a Socialist?1

So what *do* Republicans mean by "socialism"? Do they mean programs like Social Security, Medicare, Medicaid, and Obamacare? If we take them at their word, they do.

After all, that's the label Republicans applied to these life-saving programs when they were first proposed by Democrats. Of course, once the programs became popular, Republicans stopped calling them socialism and stopped attacking them directly.

Instead, Republicans floated proposals to "save" or "improve" these programs (by starving or hobbling them). Their efforts failed because most Americans don't want to privatize Social Security or turn Medicare into a voucher system or "fix" Obamacare by allowing insurers to once again refuse coverage of pre-existing conditions. If these programs are examples of socialism, Americans seem to like it.

That's why Republicans become so unhinged when Democrats propose legislation that would improve the lives of average Americans rather than the bank balances of the top 0.01% of Americans. And that's what was behind Rubio's embarrassingly over-the-top attack on the Build Back Better Act (BBBA).

A key component of BBBA was reauthorization of the Child Tax Credit that had been part of Biden's America Rescue Plan Act but was expiring at the end of last year.

The Child Tax Credit was <u>estimated</u> to have cut childhood poverty by 30%, and it is likely to be included in a stripped-down version of BBBA to be introduced within the next few months. At that point, expect to see Marco once again trot out the socialist bogeyman, designed to whip the
